KSL 5 NEWS ANCHOR CAROLE MIKITA TO DELIVER PROVO COLLEGE COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

PROVO, Utah (May 17, 2011)—An award-winning journalist who holds one of the top broadcast news anchor positions in Utah will deliver Provo College’s commencement address on May 21, 2011. Graduation exercises will begin at 10:00 a.m. at the Marriott Downtown Hotel and Conference Center, 101 West 100 North Street, Provo.

Carole Mikita has been an anchor and reporter at KSL 5 News since June 1979 and has been recognized by the Society for Professional Journalists and the Utah Broadcasters Association. She has produced and hosted documentaries and has made cameo appearances as a reporter in the movies “Out of Annie’s Past” (1995), “Double Jeopardy” (1992), and “Deliver Them from Evil: The Taking of Alta View” (1992). In 1998, Mikita received a regional Emmy Award for her documentary “Gideon’s Story”. Because of her dedication to people with disabilities, she was honored in 1994 by the Utah State Office of Rehabilitation, and in 1996, the Assistance League of Utah named her a “Woman of Distinction”.

“We are very honored to have such a notable television news anchor deliver our Commencement address,” said Gordon Peters, president of Provo College. “Carole Mikita has established herself as a front-runner in broadcast journalism.” Peters knows that the graduates of Eagle Gate College will learn much from Mikita. “As our graduates transition from our classrooms to the real world, having such an inspirational person share her experiences with them will help motivate our graduates to their own futures.”
